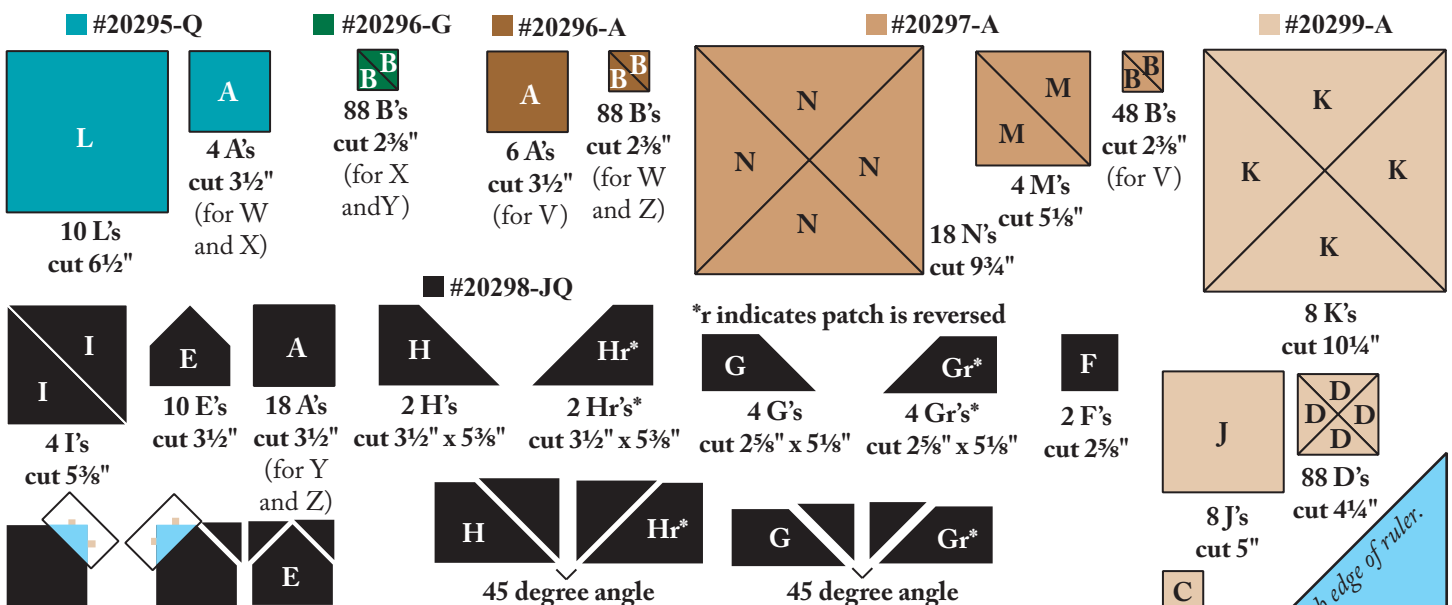

	#20296-G Green Dots	3/8 yard
	#20296-A Tan Dots	3/8 yard
	#20298-JQ Black/Teal	1 yard
	#20297-A Brown	1 yard
	#20299-A Tan	1 1/4 yards
	Binding (#20296-G)	1/2 yard



Rotary Cutting Dimensions for Various Patches

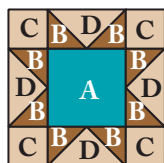
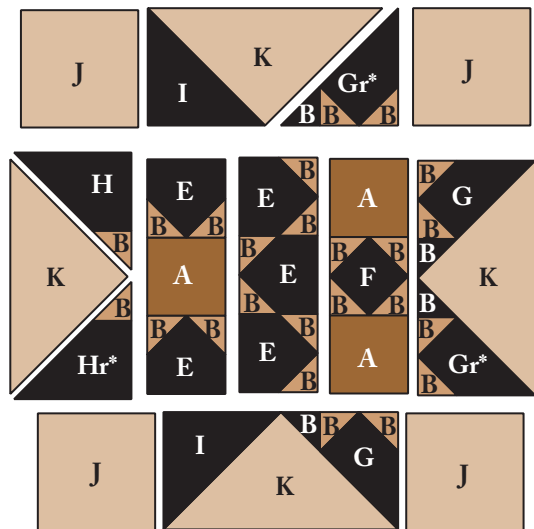
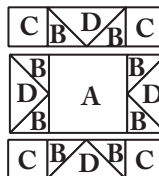
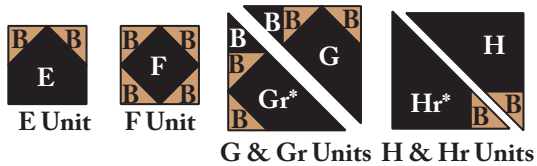


E Detail: Cut 3 1/2" square; tape tracing of blue triangle to back of ruler as shown. Align with corner of square and cut along ruler. Repeat at adjacent corner to complete E.

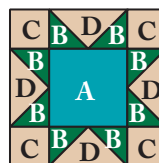
G & Gr, H & Hr Detail: Cut rectangles in dimensions listed. Cut off one corner as shown, aligning your ruler's 45-degree line with one corner of rectangle. If you use a Shapermaker 45 tool, you may use listed measurements for the strip and the angled cut, and it won't be necessary to cut rectangles first.

Trace this triangle and tape to ruler to help you cut E.
Align this side with edge of ruler.

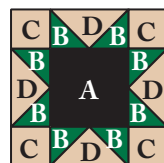

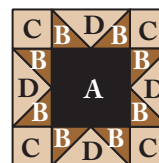

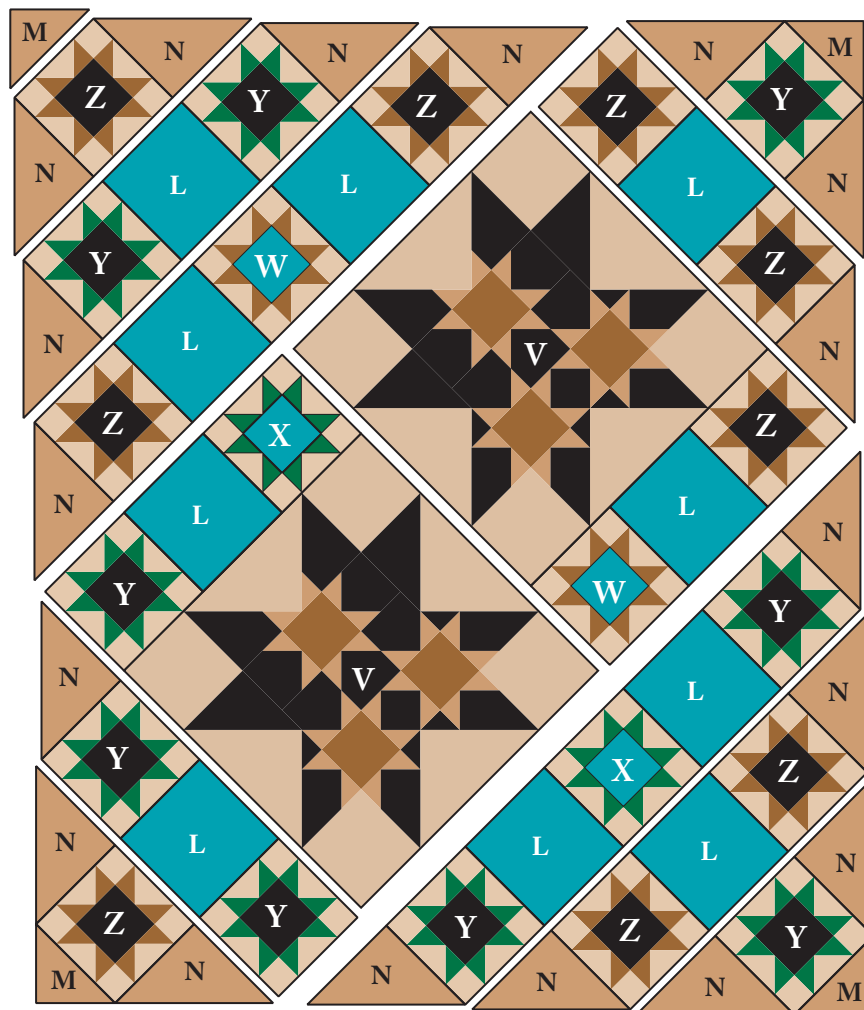

Rotary Cutting

This quilt is made from rotary-cut patches. Patch colors and dimensions are shown in the figures on the previous page. In this pattern all of the cutting dimensions for patches as well as border strips include seam allowances but no extra for insurance. More detailed instructions for rotary cutting G and H patches and their reverses are given at the bottom of the first page.

Cut off and set aside for borders and backing 136" x 40-45" of teal fabric #20295-Q. From the remainder of this fabric cut L and A patches as shown on page 1. Continue cutting all fabrics, cutting larger patches before cutting smaller ones from the same fabric. Note that if only one dimension is listed for a shape, use that dimension to cut the strip and to cut it into squares, as well. If a second dimension is listed for a patch, use that measurement for cutting the strip into patches.

Block Construction

For large blocks, start by making 10 E units, 2 F units, 4 G units, 4 Gr units, 2 H units, and 2 Hr units as shown at top left of this page. Join these, along with I, J, and K patches to make two V blocks as shown at left.

For small star blocks, start by making 44 B-D-B flying geese units using green dots and 44 more using brown dots. Use these along with A's and C's to make 2 W, 2 X, 9 Y, and 9 Z blocks as shown.

Quilt Assembly

Arrange blocks plus L, M, and N patches as shown in the quilt setting diagram at left. Begin quilt assembly with the large blocks. Make a unit by sewing an L patch between a W and a Z block. Make another unit with an L patch between Y and X blocks. Sew one of these units to each large V block as shown. Join these two sections. Join the remaining parts in diagonal rows as shown to make the quilt's four corners. Stitch these to the quilt center.

Finishing

Cut backing fabric to make 2 pieces 30" x 68". Join them along the long side. From remaining fabric cut 4 borders, each 4 3/4" x 51 1/2". Stitch a border to each long side of the quilt. Stitch the remaining borders to top and bottom. Layer, baste, and quilt as desired. Cut binding strips 2" wide. Join them to make one strip 230" long. Press in half lengthwise and sew binding to the quilt.
